Oconomowoc podiatrist named Scholl College alumnus of the year

Dr. Jack Hutter, a longtime podiatric physician in Oconomowoc and the greater Milwaukee area, was recently honored as the Dr. William M. Scholl College of Podiatric Medicine Alumnus of the Year.

Dr. Hutter is also the 2014 recipient of the college's Honor Medallion. Founded in 1912, Scholl College is one of five colleges of Rosalind Franklin University of Medicine and Science in North Chicago, IL, which also includes the Chicago Medical School, College of Health Professions, College of Pharmacy and School of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies.

Board certified in foot and ankle surgery, orthotics, prosthetics and pedorthics, Dr. Hutter is a fellow of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons and the American Professional Wound Care Association. He graduated cum laude from Scholl College in 1981 and since 1998 has served on the SCPM Alumni Association Board, advocating for the college and its students through various leadership capacities.

In an awards ceremony during RFUMS Fest on Oct. 18, the university cited Dr. Hutter's strong advocacy for the podiatric profession and Scholl College students and praised him for setting "a new bar for alumni leadership."

Dr. Hutter serves as a visiting professor for Scholl College. He is a member of the Wisconsin Society of Podiatric Medicine Board, American Podiatric Medical Association and Pedorthic Footwear Association. In 2011, he was awarded honorary membership in the Prince Edward Island Podiatry Association in recognition of his contributions to the Canadian Federation of Podiatric Medicine.
